Editor's Note Br. Aubert Pereira

Greetings Brother Knights!

My apologies for the late issue of this newsletter. Over Christmas and New Year, Phoebe and I were in Edmonton, visiting with our 7-week old grandson.

In these times, when the greetings "Merry Christmas" and Happy Holidays" are almost interchangeable, and getting a true Christmas Card is very difficult, it was refreshing to read the National Post on the 24th December. The editorial was titled "The child born in Bethlehem", and alongside it was an article titled "An unabashed Christmas show" by Fr. Raymond deSouza, who is, of course, a member of our Council. Letters to the paper in the following days highlighted that the Post was the only national newspaper to focus entirely on the message of Christmas, with no sidetracking to the so-called holiday season.

To quote from the National Post first:

Christians celebrate at Christmas the coming of God as man, the eternal Son of the Father coming as man in Jesus Christ.

God is on the side of man. That was the good news first promised to Abraham, when he was told that his descendants would be as numerous as the stars of the sky and the sand on the seashore. The Christian claim is bold. Just as the Jewish people were chosen not only for themselves, but as a blessing for all nations, so too does Jesus Christ come to offer the gift of salvation to all peoples. Indeed, for Christians, Bethlehem remains always more important; more important than Rome and Athens and Kyoto and Ottawa and New York and London, and other capitals ancient and modern.

Fr. Raymond deSouza's article was about a Christmas show at the National Arts Centre, with the NAC symphony orchestra and Leahy, the fiddling, singing, step-dancing family from Lakefield, Ont.

It was an unapologetic and unabashed Christmas show, with actual Christmas carols sung about the actual birth of Christ.

As for Leahy themselves, they sang special hymns which they first learned in the choir at their local parish, including some original compositions for Midnight Mass.

Celebrating Christmas without Christian faith would be like marking Canada day without reference to our own history.

I believe that the Knights of Columbus have a lapel button, which states the Christian message:

JESUS IS THE REASON FOR THE SEASON

It is worth remembering this message in 11 months, when we celebrate Christmas once again.


