Dear Brother Knights

I respect the opinion of Cardinal Mahoney of Los Angeles. His article “**Fostering the Baptismal Priesthood in the Year of the Priests**” is long but states the case accurately.

POSTER PROGRAMME Br.Val Dumais

The programme has as its goal making students in the elementary school system aware of the possible damage that alcohol or drug abuse can have on families and individuals.

This year, an attempt was made to make the teachers from Grades Four through Eight aware of the Programme, so that they can build on this knowledge for next year. One result of this initiative is that we doubled the number of entries compared to 2009. The posters have been evaluated at the school and Council level and the posters of the Council winners brought to Smiths Falls for judging for the Archdiocese of Kingston. At this point, we do not know if any of our entries were winners at the Archdiocesan level.

The school and Council winners will be receiving their awards during the latter part of April at an awards ceremony to include also the winners in the Basketball Free Throw Competition.

Thank you to the teachers and students who participated in the Poster Programme and to those who provided their talents in judging the posters.

BASKETBALL FREE THROW by Br. Shaun Tymchuk

Three years ago Council 9652 decided to conduct our basketball free throw (BBFT) competition as an in-school event in an attempt to attract more children to enter. Over the preceding years, the number of participants had gradually diminished to the point that less than 12 children participated in a Saturday afternoon competition at Holy Cross Secondary School early in December 2006 -- this disappointing result after advertising in ten local elementary schools. We realized that we could not compete with weekend activities, so with some coaching from Br Bill Coppens whose daughter-in-law Pamela taught at St Marguerite Bourgeys School, we tried a new formula that would integrate our competition into the school program as a complement to physical education during the school basketball season, for boys and girls between the ages of nine and fourteen.

In January 2008, we approached the four catholic elementary schools closest to St Paul the Apostle Church at the start of their basketball season. Only St Marguerite Bourgeys (St MB) School responded positively that first year and a total of 53 children participated -- thank you Pamela Coppens and Vice Principal Carmine Minutillo for helping us to get started!! Last year, Mr Minutillo was appointed Acting Principal of Mother Teresa School (MT) and we were invited into his school in addition to St MB. In 2009 a total of 187 children participated, Council 9652 dominated the District 93 competition and our children won two firsts and a runner up at the regional competition in Trenton. This year, we again approached the four local Catholic Elementary Schools and we were delighted to add Archbishop O'Sullivan School (ABOS) to the list of schools participating, thanks to the interest of School Secretary Kathleen Rebelo and Principal Susan Murray. With a total of 243 children participating, every school won at least one trophy and these will be presented by our Knights in the schools after Easter. Moreover, Council 9652 again did very well at the District 93 competition this year, winning six of the nine categories that we entered. The regional competition will take place on 6 March in Trenton and we look forward to the results.

Brother Knights sometimes ask me why we go to the effort of conducting the BBFT competition. This is a reasonable question -- what's in it for us? First, BBFT counts as a major youth activity toward our Council's eligibility for the Columbian Award and, in turn, the Star Council Award each year. Second, BBFT strengthens our working relationship with our parish schools, giving us more opportunity to contribute positively to the development of our youth and, indirectly, giving our youth a positive awareness of the Knights of Columbus. Those Knights who assist with conduct of BBFT for the first time almost invariably tell me how enjoyable it is to work with the children and how good they feel for helping to make such a fun event available to our children through the gift of just a morning of their time. And many are surprised to learn that absolutely no basketball skill is required to help!! Finally and, perhaps most importantly, BBFT is an outstanding fraternal activity which bonds our Council Knights more closely together. So I would like to thank all those brother Knights who have helped to re-invigorate the BBFT in Council 9652. This year, my sincere appreciation goes out to Brothers Art Arsenault, Armand Bedard, Pierre Brunet, David Caracciolo, Bill Coppens, Gary Davis, Martin Elderhorst, Val Dumais, Howard Gallivan, Robert Generoux, Phil Healey, Paul Michiels, Hank Noonan, Aubert Pereira, Gerard Simpson and Allan Soini. There is always room for Knights to participate in BBFT, especially if we decide to expand again next year. Please contact me directly if you are interested.
